of an  
Emergency Operations  
Center (EOC)



The EOC reinforces interoperability among the various system components and makes response more efficient and effective by coordinating available resources.



Traditionally, an EOC is not an on-scene incident command post (ICP) – where the focus is on tactics to deal with the immediate situation.

An EOC is used to support on-scene activities through the prioritization of activities and the allocation of available resources.



In a major event, the fire district will not have the capacity to assume the Incident Command function.

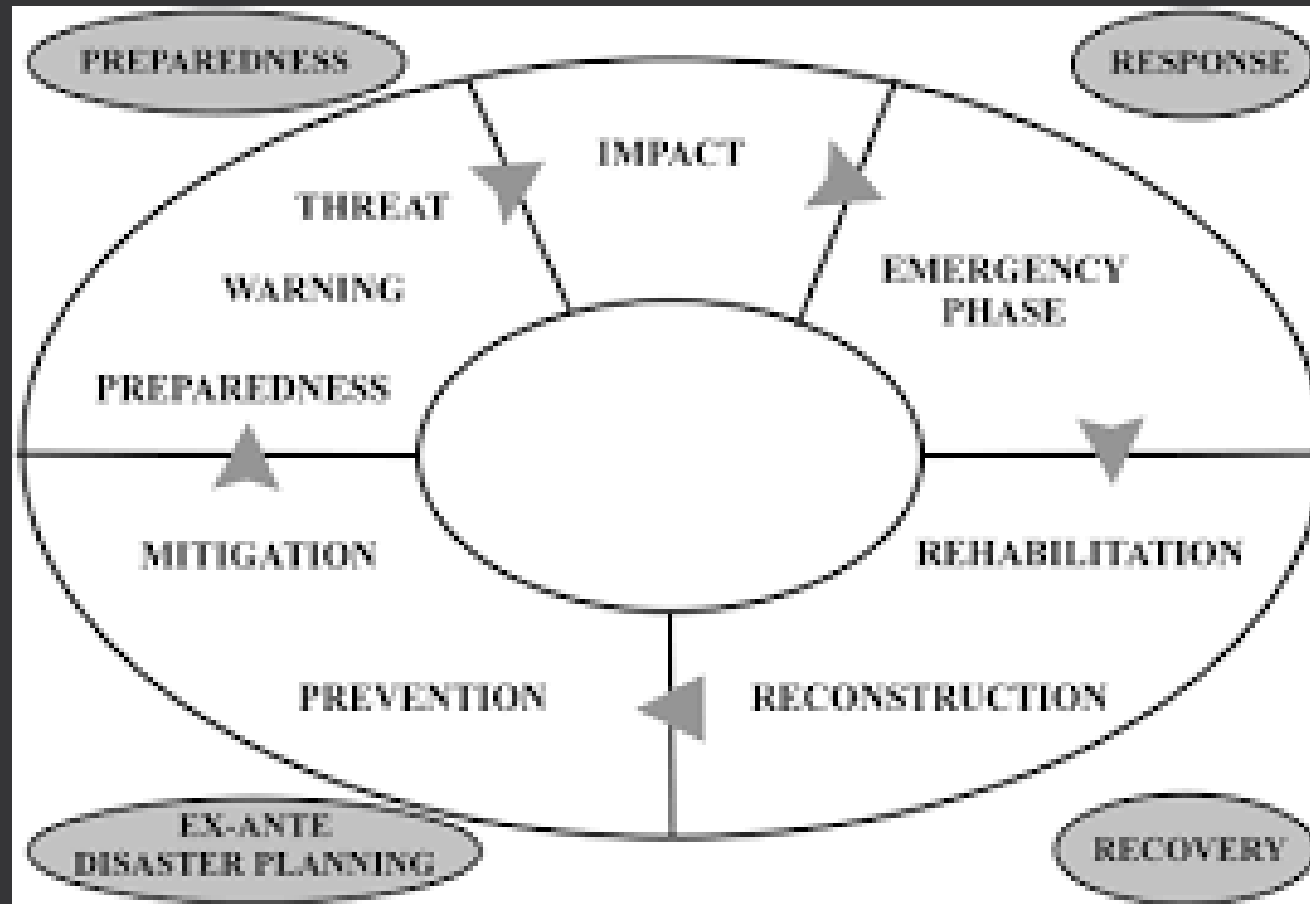
