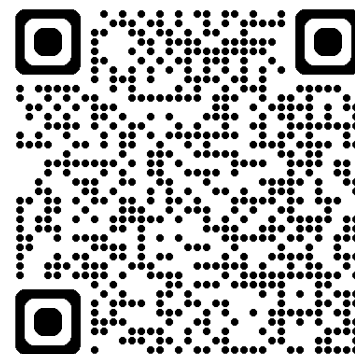

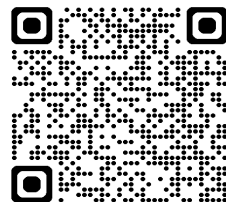

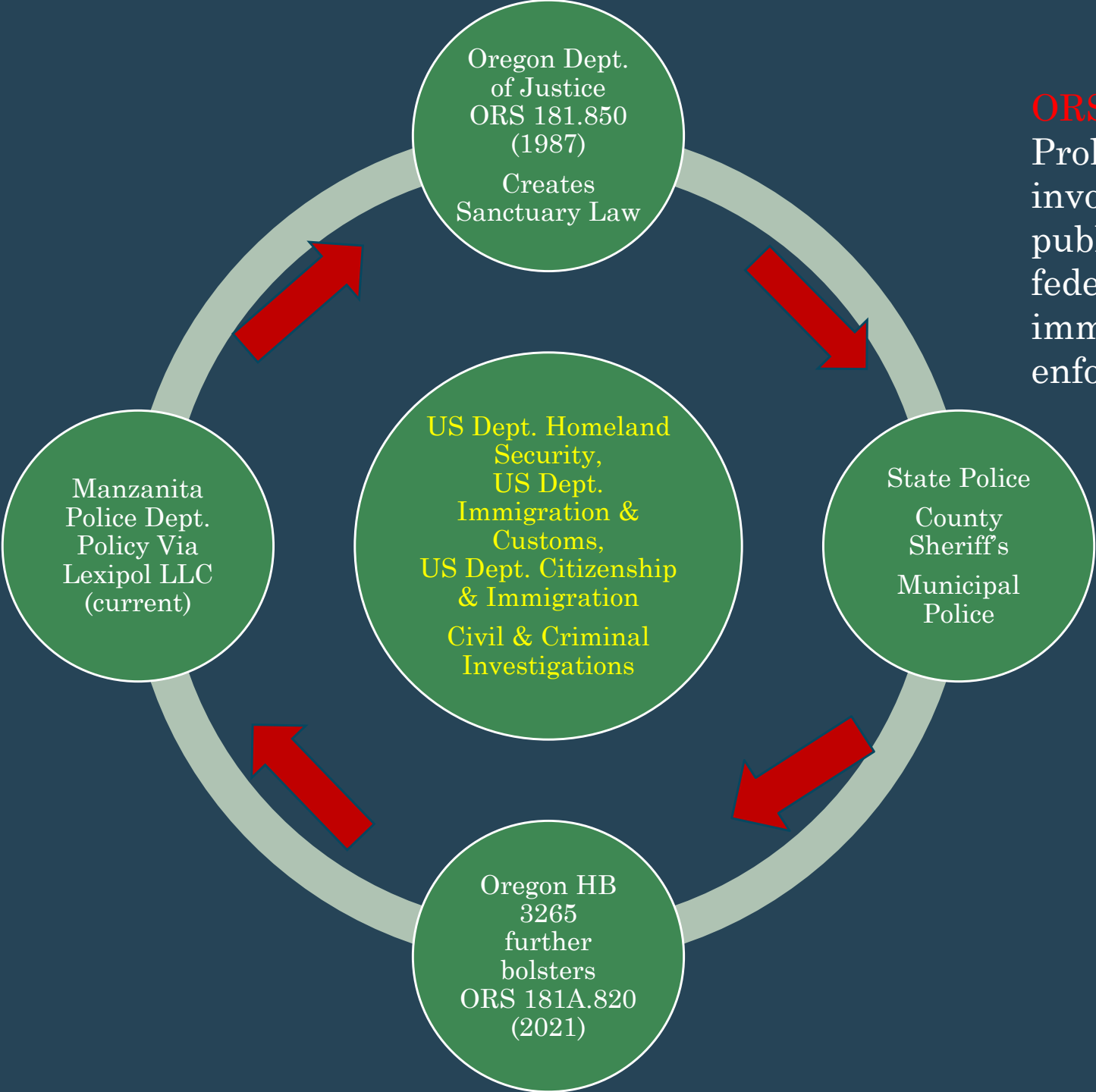

ORS 181.850
Prohibits involvement of public bodies in federal immigration law enforcement.

HB 3265
Increased transparency and accountability regarding government interactions with federal immigration authorities.



An entry from an Oregon Association of Chief's of Police and Oregon State's Sheriff's Association Training Memorandum dated January 8th, 2025...

Local Enforcement Officers Can:

Request information **from** ICE about a person named in ICE records for a local criminal investigation. **ORS 181A.820**

Arrest a person wanted under certain federal **criminal** immigration statutes when there is a warrant sign by a federal judge (not signed by an ICE official). **ORS 181A.820**

Provide information to ICE about a person in custody **if the information is available to the public or in response to a subpoena from a court** (not an ICE administrative subpoena). **ORS 181A.823**
